Dental Hygienists are important members of the dental health care team who work with dentists in the delivery of dental care to patients. Hygienists use their knowledge and clinical skills to provide dental hygiene care for patients. They use their interpersonal skills to motivate and instruct patients on methods to prevent oral disease and to maintain oral health. The Dental Hygienist is responsible for the detection and treatment of periodontal diseases and periodic hygiene maintenance. The Dental Hygienist uses x-rays, mirrors, explorers and other diagnostic procedures to perform these functions.

Key Responsibilities

Participates in patient education of oral hygiene instruction and other dental related areas. Performs charting on patient by presenting problem, medical and dental history, and perio and tooth charting. Reviews social and health history of patient during each visit. Reinforces treatment plan for patient. Attends office training and meetings along with continuing education classes as needed. Cleans hygiene room, sterilizes instruments and prepares hygiene room for patients. Exposes, processes and evaluates developed radiographs. Takes and records blood pressure, temperature, color, respiration and pulse of patient. Experienced Dental Hygienists are also allowed to place and restore fillings with the discretion of the Dental Director. Performs the following procedures:
